

# Jesus prays for Us

In the season of Ascensiontide, we remember that Jesus takes our humanity into the heavenly place and intercedes for us before God. Knowing that his disciples would face challenges, Jesus prayed three things:

For our protection in the spiritual battle between the forces of good and evil. For our unity, that all followers of Christ would be one, as he and the father are one. For our sanctification - that we would be set apart for sacred use, or made holy.

What is the reality of trying to live our lives in the complexity of our world today, whilst being faithful to all that God calls us to be?

We will each face our own challenges and can draw strength from the spiritual practice of developing a Rule of Life. Individually and together in community, as we are guided by the Holy Spirit, a Rule can help us to become more like Christ. In the same way that a trellis trains a plant to grow strong and healthy, a Rule of Life acts as a flexible framework, to help us live out our faith as disciples in the rhythms and relationships that make up our everyday lives. All this stems from the deep security in knowing ourselves loved by God, and in obedience to the command of Jesus to Abide in his love. We begin by establishing our shared life in God by **Loving** (God, our neighbour, ourselves), **Living** (sharing life together in community) and **Serving** (sharing life in all its fullness in mission and ministry to others). As we pray that God's Kingdom would come in this place, may we know that Jesus is praying for us too.

#### Psalm 1

- Blessèd are those who do not follow the counsel of the wicked: or linger in the way of sinners, or sit down among those who mock.
- But their delight is in the law of the Lord: and on that law they meditate day and night.
- 3. They are like trees planted beside a watercourse: which yield their fruit in due season.
- 4. Their leaves also do not wither: and look, whatever they do it shall prosper.
- 5. As for the wicked, it is not so with them: but they are like the chaff, which is driven away by the wind.
- 6. Therefore the wicked shall not be able to stand when judgment comes: nor sinners in the assembly of the righteous.
- 7. For the Lord watches over the way of the righteous: but the way of the wicked is doomed.
